Stage 2 Water Conservation has been Activated

The District is not running out of water, the move to Stage 2 is due to operational issues that are making it difficult for staff to produce sufficient clean drinking water to meet current demands. A reduction in use will potentially eliminate the need to activate water sources that do not meet Canadian Drinking Water Standards which would result in a Boil Water Notice for the community.

During the **Stage 2** Water Conservation Measures, no person shall use a watering system to water a lawn, garden, or landscaped area on a property except:

(EVEN NUMBERED ADDRESS)

At premises with even numbered civic addresses, on Wednesdays and Saturdays between 8:00 P.M. and 12:00 Midnight.

(ODD NUMBERED ADDRESS)

At premises with odd numbered civic addresses, on Thursdays and Sundays between 8:00 P.M. and 12:00 Midnight.

During Stage 2 Water Conservation Measures, the following uses are permitted:

- Hand watering of flower gardens, vegetable gardens, decorative planters, shrubs or trees. Drip irrigation or micro sprinkler irrigation for watering flower gardens, vegetable gardens, decorative planters and shrubs or trees is also permitted. Hand watering of lawns or grass is not permitted.
- Prevention or control of fires.
- For health or safety of any person.
- Use authorized by a permit issued by the CAO, Director of Public Works or designate (District of Lillooet Water Conservation Bylaw 2010, No. 340 Schedule "B")
